

EXAMINE YOUR FAITH

The consequence of man's very first sin was his spiritual death. More precisely, this first sin resulted in the corruption of the spirit, inherited by all humankind. This corruption lies in total loss of desire for God; preventing people from trusting God and from choosing righteousness. The consequences of this corruption lead to judgment of the soul after death. Only because God is merciful, full of love and grace, some people receive a promise of salvation from God. God, in His mercy, chose some of us, out of all mankind, to restore life in our souls. His amazing grace reestablished our desire for God and enabled us to choose righteousness over unrighteousness. God gave us a new nature at salvation. Our new will gives us the ability to choose surrender and obedience to our Holy God. God is Holy and this is why He would never look on our iniquities. Therefore, considering the fact that all people are sinners and come short of the glory of God, He must cleanse our sins before we stand in the presence of God. God's grace in choosing us, causes us to come to Him, in repentance, to be born again in spirit. While washing off our sins with the blood of our Lord Jesus Christ we are born again and we receive new regenerated natures. Only Christ's blood can make us pure, as God is pure. Only Jesus Christ's sacrifice cleansed us of our sins, for we alone are not able to do so. Only by God's grace, are we able to exercise faith in our Lord Jesus Christ and

His promise of salvation. Through faith, we surrender to Christ in total obedience. Therefore, God's grace gives us our faith, so we cannot separate our faith from God's grace. In the same manner, our faith results in our obedience to God and our approval of His ways, so we must not separate our obedience from our faith. Salvation is by faith alone, but faith cannot be alone. Satan also believed that there is God. Faith will be sincere followed by good works. Faith without works is dead, because the kind of faith, which is not sincere, cannot bring salvation. If you believe that, you are saved by being born again, but your life style and attitude toward sin did not change since, you received your salvation, meaning that you did not follow your faith with good works, then there is a very good chance that your faith is not sincere. Not sincere means not real and not real means that you are not saved at all. Believing in God but not doing anything about it is called easy believism and this kind of believing does not save you. Real-sincere faith shall combine with our repentance. Repentance is a change of mind about sin and repentance combines with obedience to God. At our regeneration, that is our new spiritual birth, God seals us with the Holy Spirit and from that moment on, the Holy Spirit dwells in us. His presence in us changes our attitude towards sinning. The Holy Ghost constantly works in us, helping us sanctify our souls. When we become saved, we begin to be motivated by the Holy Spirit to reject sin from our lives. Our conscience starts to recognize temptations and we develop hatred of sin. Faith means complete trust and trust means approving Gods ways and obedience to Him. Because we have faith in God, we obey Him; because we obey

Him, we disregard our own worldly ways, and approve and trust God's ways and follow them. Often people wrongly say that they invite Jesus in to their hearts. This sounds comforting but this kind of thinking is very dangerous. It can lead us to easy believism. We cannot forget that Jesus Christ is the One who showed us His mercy and gave us the fruit of His grace. We did not choose God, but God chose us. We were dead and He gave us life. We could not invite Him into our heart because we were dead and we could do nothing about it. It was He, who chose us and restored our lives. Jesus Christ is not a guest who comes to our heart. Guests we could ask to leave when we get tired of them. Jesus Christ is our Lord and Savior. In his merciful grace, He chose us and gave us our new life. We are His vessels and His creation. He is the Potter and we are the clay. He does not serve us but we must serve Him. Jesus Christ is our Savior and our Redeemer. If we have faith in Him then we shall obey Him, because if we do not obey Him then the question is: What kind of faith do we have? Thus, considering the entire complexity of faith, lets try to re-think our attitude towards faith and lets make sure that it is sincere. Surrender to Jesus and obey Him. Do not sin! Spend the rest of your life doing good works and obeying your Lord Jesus Christ! Pray often! Read the words of God daily! Examine your faith often, to be sure that you really are saved! If you are saved, then remember that God shall judge our every work, whether it is good, or whether it is evil.

FAITH WITHOUT WORKS IS NOT SINCERE

II Corinthians 13:5-8

But I trust that ye shall know that we are not reprobates. Now I pray to God that ye do no evil; not that we should appear approved, but that ye should do that which is honest, though we be as reprobates. For we can do nothing against the truth, but for the truth.

James 2:17-26

Even so faith, if it hath not works, is dead, being alone. Yea, a man may say, Thou hast faith, and I have works: shew me thy faith without thy works, and I will shew thee my faith by my works. Thou believest that there is one God; thou doest well: the devils also believe, and tremble. But wilt thou know, O vain man, that faith without works is dead? Was not Abraham our father justified by works, when he had offered Isaac his son upon the altar? Seest thou how faith wrought with his works, and by works was faith made perfect? And the scripture was fulfilled which saith, Abraham believed God, and it was imputed unto him for righteousness: and he was called the Friend of God. Ye see then how that by works a man is justified, and not by faith only. Likewise also was not Rahab the harlot justified by works, when she had received the messengers, and had sent them out another way? For as the body without the spirit is dead, so faith without works is dead also.

OBEYING GOD MEANS: GOOD WORKS AND NOT SINNING

Titus 3:7-8

That being justified by his grace, we should be made heirs according to the hope of eternal life. This is a faithful saying, and these things I will that thou affirm constantly, that they which have believed in God might be careful to maintain good works. These things are good and profitable unto men.

Galatians 5:19-26

Now the works of the flesh are manifest, which are these; Adultery, fornication, uncleanness, lasciviousness, idolatry, witchcraft, hatred, variance, emulations, wrath, strife, seditions, heresies, envyings, murders, drunkenness, revellings, and such like: of the which I tell you before, as I have also told you in time past, that they which do such things shall not inherit the kingdom of

God. But the fruit of the Spirit is love, joy, peace, longsuffering, gentleness, goodness, faith, meekness, temperance: against such there is no law and they that are Christ's have crucified the flesh with the affections and lusts. If we live in the Spirit, let us also walk in the Spirit. Let us not be desirous of vain glory, provoking one another, envying one another.
